3. **The full-text of the thesis will be automatically published in SOKENDAI repository on and after the expected date written in (2).** When you expect that the reason(s) will not cease to exist by the originally expected date, you must submit "Application for Continuance for Non-publication of the Doctoral Thesis in Full-text" to the chair of the program/department before the originally expected date.
4. If you hope to publish the full-text of the thesis before the expected date since the reason(s) cease to exist, you must submit "Notice of Authorization to Publish the Full-text of the Doctoral Thesis" to SOKENDAI Hayama Library.
5. If you cannot expect the date on which the reason(s) cease to exist under special circumstance, please write "To be determined" in (2). Once the reason(s) cease to exist, you must immediately submit "Notice of Authorization to Publish the Full-text of the Doctoral Thesis" to SOKENDAI Hayama Library.

Extract of the Detailed Regulations Concerning Publication of Doctoral Thesis

Article 3. In accordance with Article 21, Paragraph 2 of the Degree Regulations, an abridged version (outline) of the doctoral thesis may be published in place of the full-text of the thesis if any of the following circumstances apply.

- (1) Cases in which the doctoral thesis contains content that cannot be published on the Internet due to reasons such as the inclusion of expressions in three-dimensional form
- (2) Cases in which publication on the Internet is prohibited due to reasons such as copyright protection, personal information protection, social impact of publication, etc.
- (3) Cases in which publication of the full-text thesis on the Internet would cause obvious disadvantages to the degree recipient due to publication in an academic journal that prohibits multiple publication, etc.
- (4) Cases in which publication of the full-text of the doctoral thesis on the Internet will cause obvious disadvantages to the degree recipient due to publication
- (5) Cases in which publication of the full-text thesis on the Internet would cause obvious disadvantages to the degree recipient due to patent applications, etc. (Note, however, that under the Japanese patent system, inventions disclosed prior to the filing of a patent application cannot, in principle, be granted a patent.)
- (6) In other cases where the Program Committee deems it unavoidable.
